Summer Camp Overview

Camp Roadrunner promises a fun, engaging and educational learning experience for youth ranging in ages 8–17. Innovative camps are offered throughout the summer. New camps include video game creation, 3D video game creation, mobile app design, Minecraft© and ROBLOX®!

Camp Roadrunner meets Monday through Thursday in half day formats – combine two classes and make a full day of camp for the week. Snacks will be provided to campers during both morning and afternoon activities. Lunch will be provided to campers who enroll in both morning and afternoon half day camp. Campers are welcome bring their own lunch if they do not want what is provided.

Camp fees include materials, supplies and a Camp Roadrunner t-shirt.

Registration Information

Registration will begin **Monday, April 15, 2019 at 8 a.m.** Parents or guardians must register in person at Angelina College, Community Services Building, Room 101. Phone registration is available with a major credit card. If registering over the phone, the registration forms must be submitted by fax, email, or in person before a camper may be registered.

Age Groups

Camps are split by two age groups, ages 8-10 or 11-17, with a maximum of 16 campers per group. *We reserve the right to combine groups or split groups if needed, but we will do so with discretion.*

Cost

Full payment is due prior to the start of camp. Cash, check and debit/credit card payments can be accepted in the Community Services Building, Room 101.

Refund Policy

A 100% refund is available until the Thursday prior to the start of camp. For more detailed reimbursement information or to request a reimbursement, please contact the Community Services Office at (936) 633 – 5206.

Illness/Injuries

You should not bring your child to camp if they are ill. If a child becomes ill or injured during the day, the parent indicated on the registration form will be notified. If a parent cannot be reached, the emergency contact person will be notified. All camp staff are CPR + First Aid certified and will administer basic first aid if needed.

Limited Enrollment

Enrollment space for all sessions and camps is limited. A minimum of two counselors will be with each age group at all times.

Additional Session Offerings

Early drop off is available for a minimal cost of \$10 per session and begins at 7:30 a.m. Late pick up is available until 5:30 p.m. for a minimal cost of \$10 per session. If children are registered for early drop off or late pick up, the parent will need to walk the children into the building and sign them in.

Session Times

Drop off and pick up will be in front of the Community Services building.

Morning sessions will begin at 9 a.m. and end at 12 p.m. Parents may start dropping off their children between 8:30 – 9 a.m. Parents may pick up their children between 12 – 12:30 p.m. if only attending the morning session at the same location.



Session Times (continued)

Afternoon sessions will begin at 1 p.m. and end at 4 p.m. Parents may start dropping off their children between 12:30 – 1 p.m if only attending the afternoon session. Parents may pick up their children between 4 – 4:30 p.m at the same location.

Snacks & Lunch

A snack will be provided during both the morning and afternoon session. If children attend both morning and afternoon sessions, a supervised lunch will be provided between 12 – 1 p.m. Children are welcome to bring their own lunch if they do not want what is provided.

T-Shirts

All campers will receive one Camp Roadrunner t-shirt at no additional charge with the first paid camp registration (but not for subsequent camp registrations). Additional shirts may be purchased for \$10 while supplies last.

Camper Behavior Policy

The Community Services staff strives to create an atmosphere that is safe and fun for all participants. Misbehavior may result in one or all of the following consequences: counselor/camper discussion, loss of privileges, parent conference, suspension or dismissal from Camp Roadrunner. If a behavior incident arises, parents will be notified.

Film & Theatre Camp

The camp will take students through the process of creating a short film and learning the fundamentals of screenwriting, acting, design and production. At the end of the camp, campers will get to participate in the world premiere of the short film with a live theatre performance!

The live performance will be Tuesday, June 25 at 7 p.m. in the ACA Black Box Theater.

This camp lasts 6 days (Monday-Thursday, June 17-20 and Monday-Tuesday, June 24-25) from 1 – 4 p.m. and is designed for children ages 13 – 18.

Hunter Safety Camp

Hunter Safety is a one-day camp for children ages 9 and up. All students who register must have their own email address. Children will earn the Hunter Safety Certificate at the successful completion of this camp. Parents may start dropping off their children between 8:30 – 9 a.m. and pick up between 3 – 3:30 p.m. Late pick up until 5:30 p.m. is available for a minimal fee.



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Safe Sitter/CPR + First Aid Camp

This camp will begin at 8 a.m. and end at 12 p.m. for ages 8-10. Parents may start dropping off their children between 7:30 – 8 a.m. and pick up between 12 – 12:30 p.m. if only attending the morning session.

This camp will begin at 1 p.m. and end at 5 p.m. for ages 11-17. Parents may start dropping off their children between 12:30 – 1 p.m. and pick up between 5 – 5:30 p.m. if only attending the afternoon session.

At the completion of this camp, children will earn both Safe Sitter and CPR + First Aid certifications. Children will also receive a Safe Sitter starter kit.

Children are permitted to take this camp one time per year.

Camper Pick Up

Pick up will occur in the same location as drop off every day. Children will not be allowed to go into the parking lot to find you.

1. Your child will be released to anyone listed on the registration forms; this includes emergency contacts.
2. Anyone picking up your child must sign your child out. **All adults picking up a child must show a photo I.D. when arriving to pick up your child.**
3. Your child will **not** be released to persons listed as not having permission to pick up your child.
4. Anyone attempting to pick up your child must provide proper personal identification and know the Family Release Code (a specific word that is predetermined by the parent and child) that you indicate on the registration form.

DO NOT TAKE YOUR CHILD WITHOUT SIGNING THEM OUT! If your child has not been signed out at the end of the day, the AC police may be contacted.

Late Arrival or Late Pick Up

Children arriving to camp late (after 9 a.m. for morning session or after 1 p.m. for afternoon session) must be escorted to the Community Services Office, Room 101, by the parent or guardian. A camp staff member will escort them to the appropriate location to meet their group.

Parents or guardians arriving late for pick up (after 12:30 p.m. for morning session or after 4:30 p.m. for afternoon session) need to notify Community Services as soon as possible. To pick up their child, parents must park in the Community Services parking lot, go to the Community Services Office, Room 101, and a camp staff member will escort the child to the parent.

Late pick up is available for afternoon sessions at a minimal cost of \$10 per week and is available from 4:30 – 5:30 p.m.
